

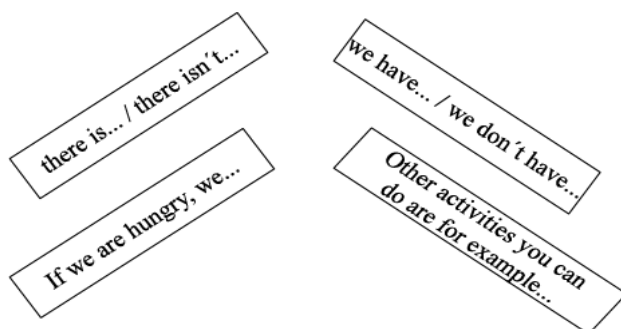

3-6	Inhaltliche Ausarbeitung und sprachliche Umsetzung ansatzweise gelungen (Aufgabenstellung ansatzweise beachtet, aufgrund sprachlicher Verstöße z. T. schwer verständlich).
0-2	Inhaltliche Ausarbeitung und sprachliche Umsetzung kaum ansatzweise erkennbar (Bezug zur Aufgabenstellung nicht erkennbar bzw. Text unverständlich).
