4. TALKING STUDENTS

We would like to hear from your students! This is why the U.S. Embassy Berlin will establish a **Youth Council** (YC) this fall. A diverse group of ten YC members will have an active role in shaping the agenda and suggesting topics for discussion on youth-related issues and transatlantic relations. They will participate in regular exclusive meetings and activities (virtual and in-person) with American diplomats about once a month. They will also periodically connect with the YC members of the U.S. Consulates Germany-wide for joint events with American experts, young leaders and activists.

Members will be recruited via an essay application process and must commit to participate actively in the YC for the duration of the school year. Since most events will be held in English, good English-language skills are desirable. **We would appreciate if you encouraged your students to apply.**
